We have reviewed the points raised in your letter and since, as I believe you already know, AUSA Robinson and AUSA Allen were not at the Hillary Clinton event as Clinton supporters but in their official capacity assisting law enforcement, we do not believe the circumstances necessitate a recusal of the United States Attorney's Office for the Southern District of California (USAO). As a result, you should direct any issues relating to the investigation to the USAO or raise them with the appropriate court.

Reference is made to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request, originally directed to the Executive Office for United States Attorneys, for information pertaining to:

1. All records related to the attendance by Assistant US Attorneys Alana Robinson and Emily W. Allen (both of the US Attorney's Office for the Southern District of California) at a Hillary Clinton presidential campaign fundraiser held in La Jolla, California on August 7, 2015, including but not limited to notes, memoranda, and authorizations, from June 1, 2016 to August 7, 2015;
2. All emails and text messages sent to or from officials in the US Attorney's Office for the Southern District of California regarding the attendance by Assistant US Attorneys Alana Robinson and Emily W. Allen at the August 7, 2015 Hillary Clinton presidential campaign fundraiser held in La Jolla, California, including but not limited to emails and text messages to the United States Secret Service which prompted a Secret Service official to send an email on August 5, 2015 with instructions for Mses. Robinson and Allen on where and when to arrive at the fundraiser to have their photograph taken with Mrs. Clinton, from June 1, 2016 to August 7, 2015;
3. All internal emails and text messages between officials in the US Attorney's Office for the Southern District of California regarding third party Freedom of Information Act requests for records relating to Mses. Robinson's and Allen's attendance at the August 7, 2015 fundraiser for Mrs. Clinton, from August 1, 2018 to the present; and
4. All emails between officials in the US Attorney's Office for the Southern District of California and other federal government officials regarding third party Freedom of

Information Act requests for records relating to Mses. Robinson's and Allen's attendance at the August 7, 2015 fundraiser for Mrs. Clinton, from August 1, 2018 to the present.

While processing your request, the above mentioned agency located records that fall under purview of the United States Secret Service (Secret Service). Accordingly, your request and the responsive documents were referred to this office for processing and a direct response to you. Your request was received by this office on February 4, 2020, and was assigned the file number indicated above.

The referenced material was considered under regulations for the FOIA, Title 5 U.S.C. § 552. Pursuant to this Act, exemptions have been applied where deemed appropriate. The exemptions cited are marked below.

Enclosed are documents responsive to your request. Exemptions under the FOIA Statute, Title 5 U.S.C. § 552 have been applied where deemed appropriate. After a detailed review of all responsive records, 6 pages were released and 0 pages were withheld in entirety. Any exemptions cited are marked below. **FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT
SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552**

Provisions of the Freedom of Information Act do not apply to matter that are:

- (b) (1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive Order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified pursuant to such Executive order;
- (b) (2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices any agency;
- (b) (3) specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than section 552b of this title), if that statute: (A)(i) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on the issue, or (ii) establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld; and (B) is established after the date of enactment of the OPEN FOIA Act of 2009;
- (b) (4) trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person and privileged or confidential;
- (b) (5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency; provided that the deliberative process privilege shall not apply to records created 25 years or more before the date on which the records were requested;
- (b) (6) personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b) (7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the information: (A) could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings; (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication; (C) could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy; (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of a confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of a record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source; (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law; (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual;
- (b) (8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for regulation or supervision of financial institutions;
- (b) (9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.




